Ian Lisk has worked in the UK Met Office International Relations team since 2006 with a focus on the World Meteorological Organisation (WMO) and aviation issues.

Ian led the Met Office's international response to the eruption of Eyjafjallajökull and since July has also been responsible for all aspects of internal Met Office coordination.

Ian began his career with the Met Office in 1987 as a weather observer. After successfully completing forecaster training in 1990 he spent the next twelve years working as an aviation forecaster, mainly at test ranges in the western UK although he also completed four South Atlantic tours. Ian joined the Met Office College as the Aviation Meteorology Training Manager in 2002 and shortly after this became the chair of the WMO Commission for Aeronautical Meteorology (CAeM) Expert Team on Education and Training (ET/ET). As chair of the ET/ET Ian has led the development of global aviation meteorology forecaster and observer job competence Standards. In February 2010 Ian was elected WMO CAeM vice-president.

Ian Lisk was born in Fokestone, UK in 1967. He is married to Helen, has three children and lives in Exeter, UK.
