Prof. Dr. Ulrich Schumann is the Director of the DLR-Institute of Atmospheric Physics in Oberpfaffenhofen, near Munich, Germany since 1982. He studied mechanical engineering in Berlin until 1969, promoted with numerical simulations of turbulent flows in Karlsruhe in 1973, habilitated in fluid mechanics and structural dynamics in Karlsruhe in 1978, was working as an Advanced Study Fellow at the National Center for Atmospheric Research in Boulder, Colorado, USA, for one year in 1974/75, habilitated in Theoretical Meteorology at the Faculty of Physics of the Ludwig-Maximilians University (LMU) Munich, and became an extraordinary Professor at the LMU in 1988. He performed atmospheric research in several fields of atmospheric physics, with more than 140 reviewed publications, several book contributions. He guided more than 50 doctoral students. He was Chapter Lead Author of the IPCC report on Aviation and the Global Atmosphere in 1998, coordinated many national and European research projects on aviation, NO_x, cirrus, lightning and climate, and environment: AERONOX, POLINAT I and II, EULINOX, INCA, TROCCINOX, ECATS, since 1992. Since 2010, he acts as WMO Rapporteur on Aviation and the Environment. Schumann got various prizes including the Thomas A. Jaeger Prize (1981), the Alfred-Wegener Medal (2002), Aachen & Munich Award for Science and Technology (2005), and the J. F Lewis Richardson Medal (2007). Recently he coordinated the DLR Falcon volcanic ash flights in April/May 2010.
